



TRAVELLING TO ZAMBIA (NEED TO KNOW/BRING/DO GUIDE)

Travelers from South Africa will require a passport and obtain a visa upon entry to Zambia. Passports must be valid for at least six months upon arrival and have at least two blank pages upon each entry. Visit the Embassy of Zambia's website (www.zambiapretoria.net) for information on other types of visas and the most current visa information. You will be required to have Malaria and Yellow Fever vaccinations prior to entering the country.

To be sure, stay up to date on all vaccination recommendations by visiting the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (www.cdc.gov) website. You must carry an original or a certified copy of your passport and immigration permit at all times. Certified copies must be obtained from the office that issued the permit. If your passport is lost or stolen, visit the Zambian Department of Immigration (www.zambiaimmigration.gov.zm) to obtain a replacement entry permit at no cost before attempting to depart the country. When driving your own vehicle across the border into Zambia, there are quite a few requirements in terms of documentation you will need to adhere to, to avoid disappointment. These include:

- Valid Passport
- Driver's license
- A certified copy of your vehicle registration papers (and trailer if you are taking one)
- Proof that your vehicle is insured
- If your vehicle is financed by the bank, you will need a letter of authority from the bank with your travel dates specified on it. If you are not the owner of the vehicle, bring a letter of authority from the owner, signed by both parties with their respective ID numbers, stating that you are authorized to take the vehicle across the border
- A valid Yellow Fever certificate for when you leave Zambia
- If your vehicle is from South Africa, you will require a ZA sticker
- Red reflector tape on your rear bumper (can be small squares on each side)
- White reflector tape on the front bumper (can be small squares on each side)
- 2 x warning triangles
- Fire extinguisher
- White and red T-signs for trailers (white ones displayed on the front right corner if you are facing forward and red on the rear right hand side, the side the traffic will pass you).
